Lights, camera, action! Step back in time with a tour of two iconic theaters in downtown Kankakee. **The Majestic** debuted in 1912 and showcased a host of well-known national and global vaudeville acts. Next, head down the block to the **Paramount Theatre**.





The Paramount opened in 1931 and has maintained its art deco heritage with a cobalt blue ceiling and intricate geometric designs in green, red, gold and silver.

From there, enjoy an afternoon tour of **Restoration Works**. Gayle and her team have been restoring historic windows for well over a quarter century and in 2017, received the Illinois Sustainability Award for the development of the Light Wave Stripper and green restoration practices.

Grab dinner and then head over to Olivet Nazarene University's Strickler Planetarium for an out of this world show on select evenings. Visit their website for show times.

Day 3:
